

**SUBJECT:** Pickleball Court Shade Update

We are interested in getting some permanent shade for the pickleball players but have changed our focus. This because of our goal to light the courts and how a permanent shade structure might affect how to deal with lighting that we will also comment on.

Therefore, this information is about putting sunshade sail canopy mesh fabrics over the bleachers facing the pickleball courts and the open area between tennis court #2 and the pickleball courts.

Those areas each have four 4-inch posts capable of holding the shade canopy and this is something we will be able to hang ourselves. It will be there to be used by anyone needing shade in that area.

Attached is a google earth image of the area indicating the location where they would be installed. A second image is a depiction of the 12' X 18' canopy. The material is a heavy-duty woven breathable fabric with 95% UV Block. The fabric allows water and air to go through freely, no pooling water in rainy days.

We would hope to be able to discuss these items with you at your July 6<sup>th</sup> committee meeting. This would give us time to get the material and have the shade up by our next tournament in September.





#### Retrofitting Clipper using the Linear Park Community Design Ideas
















#### Phasing Strategy for Clipper Drive Redesign


Phase 1: Wall Aesthetics









Phase 2: Path Solution and Boulder Seating
