 General Manager Mike Davies combined Items E-1 and E-2. General Manager Mike Davies advised Town staff is recommending cancellation of the Water and Wastewater Committee Meetings scheduled on December 2, 2020 and January 6, 2021 due to closure of the Town Office and insufficient time to create and post Agendas. Motion to approve Discussion Items E-1 and E-2 as presented made by Vice-Chair Mayer.

3. Discuss Update on Denitrification & Diffuser.

Water and Wastewater Manager Aaron Goldsworthy advised the Denitrification Project is on track to begin designing this month. Estimated 3-4 months for the designing process. Water and Wastewater Manager Aaron Goldsworthy also gave update on the Outfall Diffuser Project. Currently permits are being submitted and the project is estimated to remain in this stage until next month. This project also is running on schedule.

Water and Wastewater Manager Aaron Goldsworthy updated the Committee on the Marlin Marina Project. Scheduled dewatering of the pipeline is to be done to send a video recorder into the pipe. The video will assess the condition of the pipeline.

Water and Wastewater Manager Aaron Goldsworthy advised that recently the Town received a letter from the State of California advising of a Notice of Violation in June 2020 and Veolia Project Manager Gerry Lemus is currently disputing the violation. More information will be available in two weeks.

Vice-Chair Mayer asked if the Town has grounds to dispute the NOV.

Water and Wastewater Manager Aaron Goldsworthy advised that it is believed the sample was not acquired by the lab properly.

F. FUTURE DISCUSSION/AGENDA ITEMS

Chair Pease requested looking into the possibility of reusing Class A waste from the Wastewater Plant. Presently the waste is not reusable due to excessive nitrogen levels and cannot be put on the ground.

Veolia Project Manager Gerry Lemus advised he will work with District Water Engineer Gregory Harris in discussing the Denitrification Project and the removal of pathogens as well as nitrogen from Class A waste to make it suitable for land application.

Chair Pease asked if there is value in purifying the Class A waste from its current state.

Veolia Project Manager Gerry Lemus said he would have to research the cost to generate and dispose the waste to weigh the benefits of land application.

Chair Pease asked Veolia Project Manager Gerry Lemus to keep the Water and Wastewater Committee informed of any updates for this topic.

Agenda Title

Discussion and Provide Possible Feedback on the Proposal to Purchase a New Sludge Dredge in the Amount of \$144,603.20 and Increase the Capital Project Total Budget to \$166,294.

Recommended Action

Discussion and provide possible feedback for Staff to bring the item to the Board of Directors meeting on February 17, 2021, to approve the quote from Crisafulli, to authorize the General Manager to execute the Town's Standard Purchase Agreement for purchase of the dredge from Crisafulli as per the attached proposal, to increase the total project budget, and to utilize reserves to pay the exceeding costs of the overall project.

Executive Summary

The Town operates an existing dredge at Wastewater Treatment Plant No. 2. The existing dredge is 18 years old and is in need of replacement. The dredge is used to pump sludge from the sludge lagoons at Plant No. 2 to the aerobic digester and dewatering equipment prior to dewatering, drying, and disposal. The dredge is the only means of removing sludge from the sludge lagoons.

The original dredge manufacture no longer makes dredges. Veolia obtained two cost proposals for the dredge replacement. One from Crisafulli and the other from Rockwell Engineering. The Rockwell Engineering proposal purchases the same OEM dredge from Crisafulli but included in the cost is Rockwell's price markup. Therefore, cost from Rockwell was more expensive than purchasing directly from Crisafulli.

There are currently no other small scale dredge manufacturers for sludge lagoons. Staff recommends proceeding with the proposal from Crisafulli. Crisafulli and Veolia will install the dredge.

The cost of the Dredge project was included in the 2020/2021 CIP number 7007 in the amount of \$110,000 based on an estimate by the previous Veolia Plant Manager. Since that time, costs have increased. The updated cost estimate including tax and freight exceeds the CIP budget amount by \$34,603.00. To protect the project budget from further change orders or other potential issues an additional 15% contingency in the amount of \$21,690 has been added to the cost of the total project budget. This brings the total budget increase to \$55,690 and the new project budget estimate total to \$166,294.

Specific Committee Action:

Provide feedback for Staff to ask the Board to take the following action at the February 17, 2021, meeting:

- a) Approve the quote from Crisafulli for a new dredge.
- b) Authorize the General Manager to Execute the Town's Standard Contract form for the new dredge in the amount of \$144,603.20 (Including Tax and Freight).
- c) Authorize the increase of the total project budget to \$166,294.
- d) Authorize the use of reserves to pay the cost of the project overages \$34,603 plus a project contingency of 15% \$21,690 = for a total of \$56,294.
