Executive Summary:

The Town commenced a salary review study in the Fall of 2015 which evaluated the salary table which has been unchanged since 2011. The revised salary table reduces the salary categories from 91 down to 21 reflecting the existing classifications of Town employees, and eliminates ranges both below the minimum wage standard as well as ranges beyond the salaries of existing employees. The revised salary table provides for increases ranging from 0 to 5%. Further, the salary table defines merit increases at 2.5% steps, providing a defined process for adjusting employee salaries within the prescribed range. At a result of this salary schedule revision, staff salaries will be increased by approximately 1.6% in the 2016/17 fiscal year.



AGREEMENT AFFECTING REAL PROPERTY

AMENDMENT TO GRANT OF EASEMENT

This Agreement Affecting Real Property and Grant of Easement (the "Agreement") is made by and between the Parties, Discovery Bay Country Club Residential Association, a California nonprofit mutual benefit corporation (the "Association" and "Grantor") and the Town of Discovery Bay Community Services District ("TODB" and "Grantee") (collectively, the "Parties"), on behalf of themselves and their successors and assigns.

Recitals

- A. Association is the owner of all Common Areas including roads within Discovery Bay Country Club as more particularly described in the Amended Declaration of Covenants, Conditions and Restrictions of Discovery Bay Country Club, as recorded on April 17, 2006, as Document Number 2006-0118933-00 of the Official Records of Contra Costa County.
- B. TODB has an existing, non-exclusive easement over and under Clubhouse Drive from Discovery Bay Boulevard to St. Andrews Drive for the purpose of the use, repair, maintenance and replacement of water and sanitary sewer utility lines (the "Utility Easement").
- C. When TOBD accesses the Utility Easement to perform its repair, maintenance and replacement of such water and sanitary sewer lines, TOBD is responsible in accordance with applicable laws to restore any property owned by the Association which is damaged in such process to the condition immediately before such work was performed, including landscaping.
- D. Association wishes to install a guard shack, gate system and related improvements (the "Improvement") over a portion of the Utility Easement for the Association's sole benefit and at the Association's sole cost and expense.
- E. TOBD does not object to the installation of the Improvement, however, TOBD will not agree to maintain the Improvement in conjunction with its work in the Utility Easement.

NOW, THEREFORE, for valuable consideration, receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, the Association and TOBD on behalf of themselves and their heirs, successors, and assigns, hereby agree as follows:

- 1. - 2. <u>Binding Effect.</u> This Agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the Parties to this Agreement hereto and their respective successors and assigns.
- 3. Complete Agreement/Modification: This Agreement constitutes the entire understanding between the parties to this Agreement with regard to the matters described herein. There are no representations, warranties, agreements, arrangements or undertakings, oral or written, between or among the parties to this Agreement hereto relating to the subject matter of this Agreement which are not fully expressed herein. This Agreement may not be altered or amended other than by a writing executed by the parties to this Agreement.
- 4. <u>Incorporation of Recitals</u>: The parties to this Agreement acknowledge and agree that the Recitals, which are incorporated as provisions of this Agreement by this reference, are true and correct.

Odyssey of the Mind Teams utilizing Community Center for the 2016-17 School Year

Recommended Action

Determine whether to waive fees for the Odyssey of the Mind program for the use of the Discovery Bay Community Center Art Room for the 2016-17 school year.

Executive Summary

The Byron Union School District has a number of students who participate in a program called Odyssey of the Mind (OM).

The OM program is a creative problem-solving competition involving students from kindergarten through college. The OM program is an independent and separate program from the school's regular curriculum. Team members work together at length to solve a predefined problem (the Long-term Problem) and present their solution to the problem at a competition.

At the September 16, 2015 Board meeting, General Manager Howard along with Amanda Dove, representative from the local Odyssey of the Minds (OM) program, requested the use of the Community Center Art Room Monday through Thursday from 3:00-5:00pm through March 2016 and that the fee's for this use be waived. The rental fees for that use when fully billed were in excess of \$4,800 if the current rental rate structure was adhered and complied with. OM coordinators offered to offset some of these revenue losses by participating in a Community Center based beautification project which includes building a K-9 agility course at the Community Center Dog Park.

At the September 16, 2015 Board meeting, after much discussion with General Manager Howard and OM coordinator's, the Board directed staff to further review with the OM coordinators and return for further action.

At the October 7, 2015 Board meeting, the Board approved the use of the Community Center Art Room Monday through Thursday from 3:00-5:00pm through March 2016 and that the OM team will build, purchase, and supply the labor for the Dog Park accessory items.

The OM program operated out of the Discovery Bay Community Center Arts Room Monday through Thursday during the 2015-16 school year. OM staff and participants were very respectful of the facility and Town staff, polite, understanding and flexible during their use of the Discovery Bay Community Center.

The OM coordinators have again requested the use of the Community Center Art Room for the 2016-2017 school year, Monday through Friday and to have the regular rental fees waived. The rental fees for that use when fully billed are in excess of \$5,500 if the current rental rate structure was adhered and complied with.
