

D. DISCUSSION ITEMS

1. Discussion Regarding Community Center Facebook Page Update.

Recreation Program Supervisor Monica Gallo discussed update on the Towns Facebook page. This page is being used as a resource for promotions and information regarding the Community Center.

Chair Graves commented that he has received many positive comments from the public regarding the Dog Park's appearance and accessibility.

Vice-Chair Gutow stated that this method of social media is popular and recommended frequent use and prompt updates on the Facebook page.

2. Discussion Regarding COVID – 19 Reopening Update.

Recreation Program Supervisor Monica Gallo provided update on most recent restrictions due to COVID-19.

Community Center was looking forward to reopening to the public. Governor Newsom has once again tightened the restrictions preventing planned activities at the Community Center to be postponed until further notice. Announcement made regarding the purchase of new windscreens for the tennis courts. Contra Costa County Sheriff's Office's Discovery Bay RAD Kids Camp has been cancelled for this year.

Vice-Chair Gutow and Chair Graves both commented on Movies at the Park. They have both recommended allowing the event to take place so long as state guidelines are being complied with.

General Manager Mike Davies reminded the Committee that we would also have to adjust staffing needs once we are able to introduce events back to the community.

3. Discussion Regarding Poe Street Dryscape Update.

Parks and Landscape Manager Bill Engelman gave update on landscaping advancements on Poe Street. Chair Graves asked about time of completion.

Parks and Landscape Manager Bill Engelman stated that everything should be done in approximately 2 weeks if all materials come in on time.

Vice-Chair Gutow commented on budget requirements for this project.

Parks and Landscape Manager Bill Engelman stated that once this test project is complete, he will gather more data to estimate future project area costs. This will allow him to pace the process at a comfortable level according to budget.

Chair Graves asked the Town to look into the possibility of inviting the public and staff to go to renovated sites to see the results of landscaping efforts.

4. Discussion Regarding Pickleball Court Update.

Parks and Landscape Manager Bill Engelman informed the Committee that the Pickleball project has been made available for the public to place Requests for Proposals as of last week. Bids have been received. Closing date for the RFP bids is July 21st, 2020.

Agenda Title

Discussion and Possible Action Regarding Landscape Contracting for Zone 8

Recommended Action

To receive direction on moving forward with a landscape solution in Zone 8. Staff's recommendation is to have the Town's in-house landscape crew move forward with landscaping on Newport Drive starting in October and Clipper Drive starting November of 2020.

Executive Summary

On July 23, 2020, the Board of Director's held a special meeting to receive an update on the District's landscaping issues and future rehabilitation plan. At this meeting, staff provided the Board with a presentation detailing each zone by landscape type, current conditions, budget and financial constraints, future issues, and proposed corrective plan. As well as introducing options for reducing high-water labor-intensive plants and landscape and replacing it with dryscape.

The Board of Director's discussed many options to resolve the landscape areas in distress. As a result, staff was tasked with acquiring contractor quotes for a major landscape clean up. This would include the elimination of weeds, removal of dead plants, and adding new ground cover and plants located at the front entrance, Discovery Bay Blvd, Clipper Drive, and Newport Drive. Once received, the quotes were to be brought back before a Special Parks and Recreation Committee Meeting. The meeting was scheduled for August 12, 2020; however, staff did not receive the quotes from the contractor in time to move forward with the special meeting. One contractor submitted a quote this week and one other contractor was not interested after meeting.

The quotes being brought forward this evening were received this week and presented to the Parks and Recreation Committee this afternoon.

Landscaping Quotes Submitted:

Landscape Contractor (Brightview) In-house Landscape Crew
