# Agenda Title:

Discussion Regarding Funding Community Center Pool Landscape and Hardscape Features.

#### **Recommended Action**

Recommend to the Board of Directors to approve funding for Community Center landscape and hardscape improvements as represented in Exhibit A in the amount of \$90,000 plus 15% contingency.

# **Executive Summary**

On April 21, 2021, a Special Park and Recreation Committee ("PRC") was held to discuss whether the Community Center Pool lawn landscaping should be upgraded. The PRC made the following recommendations:

- 1) All green space be artificial turf. Grass requires long term care and watering, and debris blows into the pool.
- 2) The walkway between the community center needs to be widened to improve wheelchair access:
  - a. Move the westside pool fencing inward.
  - b. Widen the cement walking path with additional concrete.
  - c. Reseed grass between the walking path and new fence line.
- 3) Widen the existing ADA pathway with concrete.

Additional cost to project is estimated at \$90,000 plus a 15% contingency for a total of \$103,500. Staff has reviewed the current budget for Zone 8 and recommends that Hofmann monies be used to fund the improvements.

The current pool refurbishment budget has about \$25,262 remaining for contingencies. Should any of this contingency remain after completion of the pool project, staff recommends spending this money on replacing/repairing concrete areas as needed around the pool.
